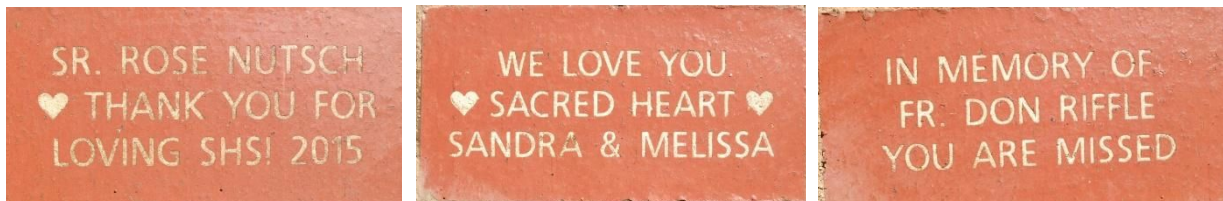

Canal Safety

This week, the canals of the Treasure Valley will be filling up, and we urge parents to discuss canal safety with kids of all ages.

A Message to Parents: Irrigation waters, whether they pass through the open countryside or through the middle of town, can be hazardous to children. Major canals, medium-sized ditches, and small laterals all pose a safety risk, particularly to young children during the irrigation season from April through October. Statistics show that drowning accidents are one of the most common causes of death for children under the age of 14 in the United States. Please ensure that your child knows how to swim and encourage swimming in a safe place like a supervised area designated for swimming. Never allow your child to swim or fish in a canal or play near a canal bank. It is important that your child understands that canals can be very dangerous. Important points:

Canals are built to carry water to farms.

Canals may look like fun, but they are not for play.

No fishing in the canals.

Never use a boardwalk to cross a canal.

Never get too close to the bank of a canal. Keep pets away.

Never climb over fences or gates near canals.

Concrete canals have slippery sides that make it impossible to climb out. Stay away!

The water in canals might make you sick. They may have chemicals that you can't see or smell.

Never swim in canals.

Chutes may look like water slides, but they are not for play. Stay out!

Some chutes have concrete blocks at the bottom that can hurt you. Stay away!

Siphons are pipes used to move water. Some have sharp edges that can hurt you. Stay clear!

Siphons are dangerous because they can pull you in.

Never play near canals, chutes, or siphons.

Always obey signs and rules.
